

Dear Ken,

We pray for you and agogo Penny every day. Keep safe and stay strong.

I would like to bring the following to your attention;

**1. The situation on the container.**

We would like for you to pursue this matter with the persons responsible. We think by now the container should have been in Malawi. The last time I talked to them, they said the container was at Songwe Border. Something might have gone wrong and we would need to know so we can help.

**2. Feeding**

We are feeding 4 days a week now. The average number of children per day is 700. We have a lot of children during the weekend.

We are trying as much as possible to let the children stay in clusters and to distance themselves from each other. No more gatherings in the hall. Covid has hit Malawi more than before but we still thank God that the villages are not experiencing hardships of disease like the urban.

**3. Hunger**

Covid is beginning to hit hard in Malawi and Kanyenyeva has not been spared in terms of its impact. The women alerted us that there was no much food left in the homes because people were unable to do peace works and earn money for their homes. We have had to distribute bags of maize, beans, and money for the maize mill, to the most affected families as per the assessment of the committee. We have also been able to share maize with all volunteers and their families.

**4. Farm**

We are happy with the crops so far. Groundnuts and bananas. The rains are in good amounts this year and we hope to have a good yield. We donated 100 bags more to Kanyenyeva, because of the needs.

**5. Days for girls**

Yami will continue to report to Penny, but we are glad with the progress. There is good communication between Kanyenyeva Wala and the other DFG in Malawi as well as the regional office in South Africa. They are continuously having outreach programs and continue to interact among themselves.

**6. Covid**

We have had more cases of Covid-19 than any other time. The death rate, as well as the infection rate, has increased. We will need to provide sanitizer, masks, soap, and other protective items for the women volunteers who cook for the children.

Funds permitting, we will need to provide masks to children as well. We are also asking those who can provide us with these materials in Malawi.

**7. Rescue Center**

I talked with Abusa Jones and Joy over the phone about the need to wind up on the business plan. Funds permitting, we should be able to do that by February and move onto the next phase.
