The success of high school students

We are planning to have a special day to celebrate the students who have passed their Malawi National Examinations this year, to encourage them and those coming behind them.

Blessings Msonthi (one who scored 14 points) has sat for the university entrance examinations. He opted for Malawi University of Science and Technology. The results are not yet out. This means that if he is successful, we will now have 2 students at university. We will soon communicate the tuition for this particular university. If taken, he will have to start school in September this year.

Status of soap business:

There is need for us to purchase more materials that we can share with the group that got the training in order for them to start their own businesses of soap making. Right now they still work as a group and for the ministry. We have been sharing the kids and the volunteers the soap they have been making and also in the DFG kits.

The above has not been done yet. Those trained will be give at least 50% of the planned amount. Looking at our funds now, we cannot pay the MK100000 as thought of initially.



Status of chicken/egg business:

The status remains the same. We have started the work, we will be sharing the progress.

Status of Kanyenyeva Wala:

Kanyenyeva Wala continues to shine! We had a surprise visit by the founder of Days For Girls, Celeste Mergens, her team and a film crew from France that came to document the progress of our work.

The founder was impressed beyond words to see the highest quality of work our team is producing and in her own words she said that Days for Girls is in over 145 countries but Kanyenyeva Walas work falls in second place in the world. The whole team was in celebratory mood upon hearing this

encouraging news. Our work is highly commended, the skill, the hygiene measures put in place, the storage system, the reporting and communication with Days For Girls International team has been 100% recommended.
