

And we will continue to see miracles... Like Jeremy's recent liver transplant... with our many prayers storming heaven, God moved in Jeremy's life. A liver was available, surgery went well, it was a very, very close match, he went through each stage more quickly than most, (ICU, Hospital, Gift of Life House and home), and the family shared precious moments together as they walked this journey. His life has been restored. What a miracle! What a mighty God we serve.

So, right now, "Maybe We Should Take A Moment to Pray." Thank Him! Praise Him! Share your worries and concerns. Lift each other up. And watch God move all around us, in His time, and in His ways as we seek to become more and more like Jesus.

It's Right Here, all you have to do is look up.

Have you ever been in a situation where you are in a large city and you are pretty sure you are in the right place, but not absolutely certain? Then, you look up and see a sign that relieves that anxiety because you "found it". As the comedian Bill Engvall says, "Here's your sign."

"Jesus, left us many suggestions as to "what signs to pay attention to." He admonishes many that they know what type of weather is coming because of the "signs" of creation. But they are not paying attention to the "signs" of His return. He tells us to show the signs of readiness, but we continue to act as if He was dead and God is no longer in control and therefore we have no accounting coming due us. He also teaches us to beware of "false signs" and not follow them as if they were prophetic. I think of the Leader of a congregation that preached "prophetic end times". This person predicted the second coming many times and became somewhat of a "poster child" for why people don't pay attention to any signs of the return.

Each time that he predicted the "end of the world', and it didn't happen, he would just "apologize" and come up with a new date. If, Jesus does return in his lifetime, he will eventually get it right.

But Jesus wasn't teaching prophetic deduction. He was teaching preparedness.

We sometimes hang on the Great Commission as the true sign. That when the Word has been spread to all nations that the end times will come.

But have we prepared the way of the Lord, especially in our own lives, regardless if the word has been spread to the hinterlands of China? The "Great Commission" is crucial, but Jesus told us this so that we may prepare ourselves to spread the Word. A recent survey showed that the greatest Mission field in the world is North America.

My Generation, schooled in a "Judeo-Christian" world order, turned our collective backs and told our children, no longer will there be discipline, no longer do you need to show respect for your elders or authority figures, and the list goes on and on. Anything that you want to do is okay.

So eat, drink and be merry, for there are no consequences.

They were eating and drinking and marrying and being given in marriage, until the day when Noah entered the Ark and the flood came and destroyed them all. Likewise, Just as it was in the days of Lot-they were eating and drinking, buying and selling, planting and building, but on the day when Lot went out from Sodom, fire and sulfur rained down from heaven and destroyed them all. Luke 17:27-29

They were carrying on as if the day of judgement was not in their foreseeable future. While we may never see the return of Christ in our lifetimes, we can prepare and be ready, so that we are not caught unaware.

He said to them, "If they do not hear Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced if someone should rise from the dead. Luke 16:31




