2023 was a busy and productive year at Kanyenyeva Ministries.

New this year!

Corn Mill: A new building and diesel-powered **corn mill** has been built thanks to a \$10,000 grant from NALC. This will not only provide milling for the mission but will also provide additional revenue as a business.

Farm: A \$40,000 gift has enabled the farm to install an **irrigation system** that will improve and expand crop growth. The farm has replaced corn with bean crops that require less expensive fertilizer to improve the revenue. Bananas are now being harvested and an additional 3000 gum trees have been planted.

Solar powered water well: Another \$10,000 gift has provided solar power on the Skills Center and a water tank and electric well pump that has replaced the hand pump on the deep bore well.

Ongoing projects

Feeding Program: KM continues to provide lunch, sports, and spiritual and health support to over 900 children in the Kanyenyeva area, six days per week. The local committee of women rotate duties daily to keep the project healthy.

Education: MOCP is currently providing financial support to send over 70 students to high school, 5 girls to boarding school, 2 young men to National High School and 5 to college! We are grateful for the numerous donors that have banded together to support these students!

Chicken/egg business: This business was relocated from Lilongwe to the Kanyenyeva mission property and is raising both egg layers and chickens for sale. It also provides employment for our local community.



Days for Girls: Kanyenyeva Wala has passed their **Gold Standard Evaluation** in every area and have continued to provide hygiene education and sanitary products for shipments all over Malawi.

Mission teams: Vacation Bible School, Business Training and a Pop-Up Medical Clinic were conducted this year by our mission team from Westwood Community Church.
