

Don't be root-bound

As a new gardener, Jan Riggensch used to treat bedding plants with extreme care, setting them into soil without disturbing the roots. Eventually she learned that rough — even ruthless — treatment is better in the long run.



"If the plant has been growing in its pot so long that the roots are circling the bottom, I jab my finger into the bottom of the soil and pull down to untangle the roots," Riggensch wrote in her gardening column. "If the whole pot is filled with circling roots, I have to be merciless. I don't worry if I break some of the roots. That's better than allowing the roots to continue to circle when the plants are growing in the garden."

In the same way, it's easy to grow complacent and inward-focused in our walk with God. But bunched-up roots can't reach out for sustenance. So for maximum faith growth, dare to let God shake you up from time to time!

Knowing that the Chikoti family is coming for our event, I want you to be aware of the documentary they helped to make called "The Bride Price". It is about under age girls being married off, sometimes, for the price of a chicken. It is illegal in Malawi for a girl to marry before the age of 18. In rural areas the tradition of using young girls, some just 12 years old, for barter is still going on. The village chiefs have a lot of influence and are trying to work together to stop this practice.

One chief in particular, Theresa Kachindamoto, has rescued some 800 girls from underage marriages. She has even sent some girls back to school. Girls in school face another challenge. It is traditional for the girl child to get up, sometimes at 2am to walk to get water. After that is done she will have other domestic chores before she can walk to school. Boarding school helps a girl to focus on her studies but it is expensive. Secondary school costs \$150 each but boarding school costs \$1500

each. Because of the cost, not many girls get to boarding school and then can't qualify for University. Education is power for a girl. She can support herself and someday pass this knowledge on to her children and help her husband manage the home.

Shadreck and Yami have started a plan for a rescue center. They are calling it Alinafe Rescue Center. They will plan for it to have education, child care, medical clinic and safety. Christmas Bazaar Meal with a Mission

FROZEN FRUIT CUPS

1 large can (20 oz) pineapple chunks or tidbits (we used crushed pineapple)
1-3/4 cup water
1- 12 oz can frozen orange juice, undiluted (partially thawed to mix well)
1-3/4 cup sugar
1/3 cup lemon juice

Combine the above ingredients and set aside

2 pkgs frozen strawberries or 1 large (16 oz)

If the berries are whole, cut in half

5-6 sliced bananas (cut thick and then in half)

2 cups frozen blueberries

Combine the fruit with the liquid and mix together. Spoon into plastic cups (we used 5.5 oz) and freeze. We put all the cups on a cookie sheet and then into the freezer. We got approximately 25 cups. Let thaw about 45 minutes and enjoy.

QUICHE

6 eggs, 1 cup ham cut in small cubes, ½ cup whole milk, ¼ cup half & half, ¾ tsp salt, ¼ tsp pepper, 1-1/2 cups shredded cheddar cheese, divided, 3 Tbsp green onions, sliced. (we used ½ tsp ground onion powder.

Preheat oven to 375 degrees. Place a pie crust into a 9" pie pan. Whisk or use a mixer to fluff, the eggs, milk, half & half, salt, pepper, onion powder.

Sprinkle the cubed ham, 1 cup of cheese, and onion (unless using the powder) onto the pie crust. Pour the egg mixture over it. Sprinkle the remaining ½ cheese on top. Bake for 35-40 minutes until the center is set. Let set for 5 minutes before cutting. Can dollop with sour cream or salsa or both.
