#### Psalm 100

Shout for joy to the Lord, all the earth.

Worship the Lord with gladness; come before him with joyful songs.

<sup>3</sup> Know that the Lord is God.

It is he who made us, and we are his [a]; we are his people, the sheep of his pasture.

<sup>4</sup>Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. <sup>5</sup>For the Lord is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

Psalm 100 is a beautiful and powerful passage. This Psalm is a wonderful reminder of where our hope and strength truly come from.



In a world that can feel so broken and uncertain, it's easy to lose our way. We may feel a deep sense of loneliness or discouragement. But this psalm, and this reflection on it, offers us a grounding truth: we are not alone. On the Lord's Day, we get to join our voices with the entire Church of Jesus Christ—a chorus of praise that spans the globe and stretches back through generations.

This isn't just a duty; it's a gift. We come together to praise God not because we have to, but because we need to. We need to remember

that God is the one who made us, and that we are his workmanship, created anew in Christ Jesus. This truth gives our lives meaning and purpose.

The most comforting part of this reflection is the reminder that God's faithfulness endures through all generations. We are living in a time of great distress, and it can feel overwhelming. But Psalm 100 encourages us to look beyond the immediate moment and anchor our hearts in God's unchanging character. His goodness, His love, and His faithfulness are not temporary; they are eternal. This is a promise we can hold on to, a sure foundation that will never give way.

Because of this, we can look to the future with hope, no matter what challenges we face. We have a God who is the same yesterday, today, and forever. His love is stronger than any hatred, his goodness is greater than any evil, and his faithfulness is more powerful than any fear. Today, and always, let us find peace in this truth and give thanks.

### **Update from the Council President**

Several motions were made at the Church Council's August meeting that helped set the Immanuel Forward project (Kehl property purchase) in motion.

The Immanuel Forward project is now well underway, with a goal of purchasing the property by October 1. The Council approved the Immanuel Forward Finance Committee's request to pursue a mortgage of approximately \$95,000, the balance needed, at this time, to finance the \$185,000 project.

The committee proposed that we use a down payment of a little over \$94,000 from the following funds:

- \$50,000 recommended from the church's finance and investment committee's assessment of our reserves (\$20,000 Fidelity Major Capital Account, \$20,000 Fidelity Memorial Account, and \$10,000 Unity Bank Major Capital Account, of which \$5,000 was used for the Earnest money to hold the purchase date to October 1.
- \$22,257.50 an undesignated Thrivent Fixed Annuity Fund that was donated to the church; and
- \$21,976.00 (Thanks to the congregation's generous envelope donations to Immanuel Forward thus far!)

The project finance committee is committed to finding ways to pay off the mortgage early, similar to the historic church expansion project, which was a much larger feat.

Bob Neros has been meeting with several people of the congregation, creating an Immanuel Forward Visionary Committee, to determine short and long-term uses of the property.

### CALL TO ORDER 6:31 P.M.

Additions to Agenda: President Char Kinzer added the following item to the Agenda: NEW BUSINESS: 3. Ranger Live Radio.

ACCEPTANCE OF AGENDA: Paula Traylor moved we accept the agenda as amended. Tom Nixon seconded her motion and it was accepted by voice vote.

CELEBRATING THE JOYS OF IMMANUEL: Two new volunteers, Vicki Burlett and Don Rasmussen have signed up to work in the sound booth; the Cantors, Sue Rasmussen and Brian Marquart; attendance has been very good this past month; Psalm 121.

### **AGENDA**

ACCEPTANCE OF FINANCIAL REPORT: Peter Nordell moved that we accept the Financial Statement. Tom Nixon seconded his motion, and it was approved by voice vote.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- 1. KEHL PROPERTY:
  - a. PURCHASE AGREEMENT: Peter Nordell moved that Paula Traylor be approved as the authorized signer for the Kehl Property Purchase Agreement. Tom Nixon seconded his motion and it was approved on a voice vote.
  - b. IMMANUEL CHURCH FINANCE COMMITTEE REQUEST: Peter Nordell moved that the Fidelity Major Capital Account of \$20,000, the Fidelity Memorial Account, \$20,000 and the Unity Bank Major Capital Account, \$10,000 be liquidated and used as part of a down payment for the Kehl Property. His motion was seconded by Bonnie LaPierre and approved by voice vote.
  - c. IMMANUEL FORWARD FINANCE COMMITTEE: Peter Nordell moved that we close the previously donated Thrivent Account #9066194 of \$22,257.50 and use the funds, along with the money raised so far by Immanuel Forward, to complete the down payment for the Kehl Property. Debbie Lindahl seconded the motion, and it was approved by voice vote.

D. IMMANUEL FORWARD FINANCE COMMITTEE REQUEST: Paula Traylor moved we authorize the Immanuel Forward Finance Committee to pursue a \$95,000 mortgage loan with Unity Bank for a fixed three-year term, amortized over 20 years to cover the remainder of the \$185,000 Kehl property purchase with the understanding the finance committee will still try to cover the loan as soon as possible. Peter Nordell seconded the motion, and it was approved via voice vote.

#### 2. COMMITTEE REPORTS:

<u>Buildings and Grounds</u>: Char Kinzer reported that the parsonage interior has been painted and sewer pumped.

Manna for Malawi: David Pundt reported all is ready for the event on Saturday.

Personnel: No report.

- 3. CLASSICAL CONVERSATIONS HOMESCHOOL UPDATE: Char Kinzer reported that the group will hold its family orientation night on Monday, September 15, 2025 and begin school on Monday, September 29, 2025. They expect 8 families to participate, educating 15 students between ages 4 and 12, Up from five families last year.
- 4. EMAIL VOTING: Discussion was held on email voting to reiterate what previous councils had decided about email voting by the Council. A consensus of the Council was that voting by email would not be used. Emergency actions will be handled by the Council Executive Committee.

#### **NEW BUSINESS:**

- 1. LCMC ANNUAL MEETING OCTOBER 5-8: Peter Nordell moved that we not officially participate in the LCMC Annual Meeting this year. Debbie Lindahl seconded his motion, and it was passed on a voice vote.
- 2. PASTOR'S REPORT/UPDATES: Pastor Ian Hewitson expressed his gratitude for work done on the parsonage.
- 3. RANGER LIVE RADIO: David Pundt moved that support of this effort would not be a good stewardship of congregation funds and should not be supported. Debbie Lindahl seconded his motion, and it was approved by a voice vote.

#### **OPEN DISCUSSION:**

Council discussed the need to update the Bylaws, Policies and Procedures of Immanuel Lutheran Church to include clarification of committee formation and record-keeping, family ministry, and funeral policies. Future workshops will be held to complete these tasks.

The Youth Ministry advisory committee had met that day to discuss confirmation and youth plans moving forward in light of Jill Decent's plans to resign from the Family Ministry position and attend school full-time. The committee recommended looking at what Salem is doing as one option. No final decisions have been made for Family ministry.

Liz's Potato Salad quantities are all personal preference

Roasted yukons

Red onion and celery, chopped small

Fresh dill

Stone ground mustard

Mayo

Sherry or red wine vinegar

Swedish Meatballs – Rosemary Kraus

2# ground beef

1 ¼ cups bread crumbs

2 eggs

1/8 teaspoon nutmeg

1/8 teaspoon allspice

1/4 teaspoon black pepper

2 onions, chopped

3/4 cup milk

2 teaspoons salt

1 clove garlic, chopped

Blend ingredients well, make into balls and brown. Take off fat. Remove balls from pan and add 2 cubes bouillon to drippings, I tsp paprika, ¾ cup sour cream, salt & pepper to taste. Thicken and pour over meatballs in casserole. Bake or simmer one hour.

<u>Liz's Version</u>: Make balls and put in casserole with oil, bake for 30 minutes @350. Save drippings and add flour to make a roux. Add cream and beef stock until thick and creamy.

#### Liz's Punch Bowl

Jello mold: Make jello as instructed, but add whatever you want—fruit, candy. Add juice or pop to help fill the mold and freeze overnight. Be creative!

The punch: apple juice, cranberry juice, Sprite, ginger and honey—substitute ginger ale or beer.
