

"What shall I return to the Lord for all his goodness to me? I will lift up the cup of salvation and call on the name of the Lord." - Psalm 116:12-13

The Unpayable Debt

Have you ever had someone do something so kind for you that you felt you could never repay them? Maybe it was a friend who helped you through a difficult time, a stranger who offered an unexpected hand, or a family member who sacrificed for your well-being. That feeling of overwhelming gratitude, mixed with the realization that your own efforts are insufficient, is a powerful one.



This is the very feeling the Psalmist explores in Psalm 116. He was at death's door, entangled by "the cords of death" and "the anguish of the grave." He cried out to the Lord for deliverance, and the Lord saved him. Now, standing on the other side of that miraculous rescue, he asks a question we all can relate to: "What can I possibly give back to the Lord for all He has done for me?"

The Symbolic Cup

The Psalmist's answer is profound. He doesn't say he'll offer up a great sacrifice or perform a grand act. Instead, he says, "I will lift up the cup of salvation." This isn't a literal, physical cup. It's a powerful symbol, much like the "cup" in Psalm 16:5 that represents all that God has assigned to a person's life.

To "lift up the cup of salvation" is to **accept** the gift of salvation that God freely offers. It is a posture of gratitude, a humble acknowledgment that you have nothing of equal value to give in return. The only thing you can do is gratefully receive the free and magnificent gift. The act of "lifting up" is a public declaration, a way of holding up this gift for all to see and saying, "This is what God has done for me! This is His kindness, and I gladly accept it."

Our Response of Gratitude

Just as the Psalmist was saved from death, we have been saved from eternal condemnation. We can never repay the price Jesus paid for us on the cross. Our salvation is a free gift, purchased not with our works, but with His grace.

So, how do we "lift up the cup of salvation"?

- We accept it: We open our hearts and receive the forgiveness and new life that Jesus offers.
- **We declare it:** We live our lives in a way that reflects His goodness, publicly calling on His name and giving Him all the glory.
- **We share it:** We tell others about the incredible gift we've received, inviting them to drink from the same cup of salvation.

We have a debt we can never repay, but we are not expected to. The Lord simply asks us to accept His gift with a grateful heart.

What is one way you can "lift up the cup of salvation" and thank God for His goodness today?

Subject: A Two-Pronged Approach to Organizational and Educational Improvement

This memo outlines a strategic plan for the next two years, focusing on enhancing the effectiveness and mission of Immanuel Church. Based on my observations over the past three months, this approach targets two key areas for development: **organizational structure** and **congregational education**.

1. Organizational Review and Streamlining

Objective: To ensure that our organizational structure and committees are aligned with the church's stated purpose and mission.

Upon review of church documents and discussions with the Council, it has become apparent that minor inconsistencies exist within our current committee structures and their interrelationships. This initiative is not a reinvention of our current framework but rather a **streamlining effort**.

We will assess how current committees, and their functions, integrate with the church's overall plan. The goal is to clarify roles, improve efficiency, and ensure that all parts of our organization are working cohesively toward our shared goals.

2. Educational and Teaching Enhancement

Objective: To deepen the congregation's understanding of God's Word through expanded teaching ministries.

The congregation has demonstrated a strong desire for in-depth biblical teaching. While the pulpit ministry will remain the cornerstone of my efforts, this plan includes the expansion of our educational offerings.

In addition to regular sermons, I intend to lead dedicated classes for the congregation and, as resources permit, provide educational opportunities for the wider community. These could take the form of specialized classes, seminars, or conferences. The specific logistics and scheduling for these initiatives are currently under development.

Expected Outcome

I am confident that this **two-pronged strategy** is achievable within the next two years. By strengthening our organizational foundation and enriching our educational ministry, Immanuel Church will gain a clearer understanding of her identity. This clarity will ultimately enable the congregation to be more discerning and unified in the process of selecting her next pastor.

Your support and cooperation are essential for the success of this plan.

OUR BIBLE and OUR FAITH

Reading the Bible is a very important part of our faith because it is a sacred text in Christianity. It is a guide for a moral life and a source of a religious scripture considered holy. It is also an authoritative source of divine revelation, sacred laws and wisdom that shape the understanding of our faith. It is necessary for spiritual growth and comfort. For believers, it explains God's nature, offers a path to salvation, provides instructions for daily living, and fosters a deeper connection with God and our community of faith.

The Bible repeatedly tells us "Do not be afraid; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go". Joshua 1:9

He will provide strength in difficult times. He will offer a comfort that dispels fear and anxiety, particularly in the face of threats or suffering. This command encourages trust in God, rather than fear of circumstances or others, assuring believers they do not have to face challenges alone and can overcome fear through faith and God's love.

Reading the Bible can impact the brain by enhancing deep thinking and focus, reducing negative emotions like loneliness and increasing positive behaviors.

"Cast all your anxiety on Him because He cares for you" is told to us from 1 Peter 5:7. God's message regarding anxiety is one of peace, trust, and surrender. He encourages believers to cast their worries on Him through prayer and thanksgiving, rather than being consumed by anxiety. Key passages from the Bible advises against worry, directing focus to God's provision and care, offering comfort and a peace that surpasses understanding.

Remember three straightforward truths:

God, the text, and the reader.

There is a God!
He speaks through the Bible!
He speaks to people like us!

Pastor Ian Hewitson opened the meeting with prayer.

President Char Kinzer called the meeting to order at 6:33 p.m.

Agenda Acceptance: Peter Nordell moved we accept the agenda as adjusted, Tom Nixon seconded his motion and it was approved by a voice vote.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Nancy Evans presented an in-depth report of the financial health of Immanuel Lutheran Church. She suggested to the Council that motions for expenditure must include the number of the account the money is coming from.

- Peter Nordell moved we accept the financial report, Tom Nixon seconded his motion, and it was approved by a voice vote.
- Bonnie LaPierre moved the recommendation to transfer \$2,500 from the Major Capital Account to the Parsonage Upkeep #6215. Tom Nixon seconded her motion, and it was approved on a voice vote.
- Tom Nixon moved the recommendation to give the Investment Finance Team permission to
 move funds invested in Fidelity between the laddered CDs and the Money Market Checking
 Account as they feel is in the best interest of the church, without seeking prior approval of the
 Council. Paula Traylor seconded his motion, and it was approved by a voice vote.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

David Pundt reported that the Manna for Malawi event was probably going to move back to the Bridge Tavern for the 2026 event. This year's event did not generate as much as in past years, but the number of volunteers from the Church was impressively greater.

OLD BUSINESS

1. Immanuel Forward:

• Char Kinzer moved to add Paula Traylor, a council member, as authorized signer for the financial accounts as presented by our finance manager, Deb Eatros. David Pundt seconded her motion, and it was passed on a voice vote.

3. Sunday School, Youth programs, Confirmation plans:

Nancy Heise reported that Confirmation of Immanuel Lutheran students would be held on Sunday, October 26. She has received five volunteers to teach Sunday School. Confirmation Youth will meet the first and third Wednesday of the month and study an on-line program; Youth group will meet the second and fourth Wednesdays of each month.

4. ILC membership roster review: The item was tabled.

5. Crow Wing County Land Statements:

Char Kinzer reviewed a number of mailing notices from Crow Wing County Land. Council agreed to delegate review of the documents and questions to the Buildings and Grounds Committee for future report and recommendations.

- 6. Youth Center Request: The item was tabled.
- 7. Heartwood Center Worship Schedule: When Pastor Paul Mattson retired, he removed Immanuel from the worship schedule for 2025. Immanuel was inadvertently added without our knowledge one Sunday in September. Pastor Ian has given them notice ILC will not participate in 2026.
