## Christ the Lord: A Reflection on Luke 2:1

My dear friends, as we come once again to the familiar story of Christmas, let us pause at the very beginning, at those profound opening words:

'In those days Caesar Augustus issued a decree that a census should be taken of the entire Roman world." (Luke 2:1)

These words, at first glance, simply set the stage. They give us the **time**—during the days of Caesar Augustus—and the **place**—the vast, powerful Roman world. Luke, the meticulous historian, assures us that the birth of our Savior was no myth, no spiritual fantasy. It was a once-for-all, **unrepeatable event** firmly planted in the soil of human history.

But we are reminded that Luke is doing something far more magnificent than merely dating a historical event. He is raising the curtain on the greatest drama the world has ever known.

## The True Crisis of History

At the very moment the great Caesar believes he is simply counting his subjects and consolidating his empire, unbeknown to him, world history is reaching its **true crisis point**. The birth in Bethlehem is not just a little story; it is the **watershed of human experience**.

From Caesar's lofty throne, the birth of a peasant Jewish baby would have been an absurdity—a "waterless cloud in an outpost of the Roman Empire."

But from the perspective of heaven, which Luke unveils for us, the truth is gloriously and decisively the opposite:

- Jesus, not Caesar, is the Lord!
- Jesus, not Caesar, is the true Savior of the world!
- Jesus, not Caesar, is the true Prince of Peace!

Caesar Augustus, with all his titles and armies, is merely the incarnation of those worldly powers and authorities that Christ came not merely to resist, but to **conquer**.

#### The Call of Christmas

Think of the sublime irony: in the very days when the Promised Land was being integrated as a Roman province, **Jesus is born**—the One to whom all authority, in heaven and on earth, would be given. He comes to make His followers the true heirs, not just of a patch of land, but of the **entire world**, integrated not by Roman legions, but by His Gospel.

Immanuel, this is the deep, practical significance of Christmas. The issue raised that first night remains the same today: Are we going to be found on the side of Christ or Caesar? Are we living for the fleeting decrees of this world, or under the eternal, loving decree of our true King?

May this Christmas season find us firmly on the side of Christ, recognizing His sovereignty over all things.

## Youth Ministry Update from Nancy Heise



This year is flying by. As we enter the season of Advent, I am working on a series of 4 lessons tying the advent season to the stories in the bible and how we celebrate within the church.

All youth age 4-11 are welcome to join us after communion for a 30 min lesson.

The confirmation students continue to study the 10 Commandments. Dec 3rd we will learn about the 5<sup>th</sup> Commandment, Thou shalt not kill. The learning objectives are:

- We will identify the ways in which we sin against (and kill) our neighbor.
- Examine how God's protection is being extended outside the home.
- Know that God is in control of life and death, and that His control is good.
- State the negative aspect of this Commandment (what we are NOT to do), and also the positive aspect (what we ARE to do).
- Distinguish between our attempts at fulfilling the Fifth Commandment, and what Jesus Christ does.

Youth group continues to study Youth Alpha. Youth group is open to all students in grades 7-12. We had several youth help in the children's room at the bazaar as a service project. We will be bagging groceries Sunday November 23<sup>rd</sup> at Super One in Crosby as a fundraiser for attending Camp Shamineau in January 2026. Camp Shamineau is a weekend of praise, worship, and outdoor fun that our youth have enjoyed attending the last few years. We will have a Christmas party December 17<sup>th</sup> and look forward to a wonderful evening of fellowship.

Looking forward, I am planning to have the milestone of  $3^{rd}$  grade bibles in January. Please reach out to me if you have a child in  $3^{rd}$ ,  $4^{th}$ ,  $5^{th}$  grade, that has not received their bible milestone.

In March, I plan to schedule 2 sessions for first communion education. Traditionally, the first communion milestone is taught to our 5<sup>th</sup> graders, however if there are older students who have not participated in this milestone, you are welcome to join us. First communion will be celebrated at the Maundy Thursday service before Easter.

Please reach out to me if you have any questions or feel called to join the youth advisory group or our core group of Sunday school teachers.

## Tis' the Season, Family and Friends!

I truly think this is the most wonderful time of the year!

A season filled with so many of my favorite things: family, Hallmark Christmas movies, gift-giving, and, of course, time with the One who gives us a reason to celebrate — **Jesus**.

But if we're honest, it's easy to get swept up in the moment and miss the deeper meaning of the season.
