## Everlasting Faithfulness:

### A Reflection on Psalm 100

The words of Psalm 100 have long set the sacred tone for public worship, serving as a timeless invitation for the global church of Jesus Christ to unite their hearts and voices in praise to Almighty God. It calls us to step into His presence with vibrant joy, lifting up songs of thanksgiving not just for the daily blessings of life, but preeminently for the redemptive work of Jesus, who died and rose again to set us free from sin. This worship is grounded in the profound assurance that the Lord is God, that He is the one who made us, and that we belong entirely to Him. As the Apostle Paul later reminds us in his letter to the Ephesians, we are God's own workmanship, purposefully created in Christ Jesus.

Beyond moving our hearts to corporate praise, Psalm 100 serves as a vital anchor for our hope, offering deep comfort particularly during distressing and uncertain times. When we confess that the Lord is good, that His love endures forever, and that His faithfulness continues through all generations, we are invited to pause and meditate deeply on these distinct facets of His character. The true power of these divine attributes lies in their absolute permanence. Unlike the fleeting and fragile nature of human commitments, God's goodness, love, and faithfulness are entirely dependable because they are eternal. We see this unchanging nature perfectly revealed in Jesus Christ, who is beautifully described in the Book of Hebrews as being the exact same yesterday, today, and forever.

It is this very permanence that allows us to look toward the future with unwavering confidence. When we cast our eyes upon the world, we are often confronted with the heavy spectacle of human evil, hatred, and infidelity. Yet, standing in stark contrast to the brokenness of humanity is the enduring Lord, who will always remain exactly who He has revealed Himself to be: inherently good, unconditionally loving, and fiercely faithful. Because His character is unshakeable, we are never left without a reason to hope. Whether we look back at the past with gratitude, stand in the present with peace, or look forward to the future with confidence, we find that every season of life gives us every reason to praise the Lord and offer Him our deepest thanks.

**A Prayer for the Heart** *Father, help us today to enter into the service of worship with true enthusiasm, eagerly submitting our hearts to your perfect will and rejoicing in the hope you provide. May we clearly see your enduring love and your unwavering faithfulness fully revealed to us in Jesus of Nazareth. Amen.*

### Everlasting Faithfulness: A Pastoral Reflection on Psalm 100

My dear friends, there is a beautiful, sacred privilege we share whenever we gather together as the family of God. Psalm 100 serves as a warm, open invitation for the whole church of Jesus Christ to step away from the noise of the world to exhale, and to lift our hearts and voices in praise to our Almighty Father. It calls us to come into His presence just as we are, yet with songs of joy on our lips. We give Him thanks for the everyday graces that sustain us, but most of all, we praise Him for the gift of Jesus, who walked through death and rose again to break the chains of sin and set us truly

free. In a world where it is so easy to feel lost or forgotten, this Psalm wraps us in the sweet assurance that the Lord is God, that He made us, and that we belong to Him. As Paul so gently reminds us in Ephesians, you are God's own workmanship—handcrafted with love and created anew in Christ Jesus.

But this beautiful Psalm does more than just guide our worship on a Sunday morning; it is a healing balm meant to nurture hope in your heart for the days ahead. I know how deeply we all need that hope, especially when we look around at the distressing and heavy times we often find ourselves living through. When we confess together that the Lord is good, that His love endures forever, and that His faithfulness continues through all generations, we are invited to sit quietly and rest in those truths. Think on His goodness. Lean into His love. Rest your weary heart on His faithfulness.

What I want to stress to you today is that these attributes of God are not fleeting. They do not fade when our circumstances change. They are dependable, they are unshakeable, and they are forever. We see this eternal heart of God perfectly revealed in the face of Jesus Christ, who is the exact same yesterday, today, and forever.

This is what makes it possible for us in this period of transition, and further, to look toward tomorrow, and the following days, months and years, not with dread or anxiety, but with quiet confidence. Yes, we often see the heartbreaking spectacle of human evil, hatred, and broken promises in the world around us. But standing over and against all that darkness is the Lord, who will always be exactly who He has shown Himself to be: good, loving, and faithful to you. No matter what lies behind you in the past, no matter what you are facing in the present, and no matter what uncertainty the future may hold, you are held by an everlasting God. You have every reason today to praise Him, to trust Him, and to be thankful.

### **A Pastoral Prayer**

*Father, help us today to enter into your presence with fresh enthusiasm, casting aside our distractions and eagerly submitting our hearts to your gentle will. As we move through this week, may we rejoice in the hope you give us, and may we see your deep love and unwavering faithfulness revealed clearly in Jesus of Nazareth. Amen.*

The council of Immanuel Lutheran Church is calling for a special congregational meeting on Sunday, July 12, to discuss and vote on the opportunity to purchase the grass field on the south side of our main parking lot.

Father Eli from St. Joseph Catholic Church of Crosby approached the council to inquire if we were interested in purchasing this lot. It is approximately .66 acres and has city water and sewer. Currently, with St. Joseph's permission, we use it for overflow parking and for storing snow, saving us the expense of having the snow hauled away.

A committee representing the council, the property team, and the finance committee have been meeting to gather facts and work on a proposal to purchase the property. The council has signed a letter of intent, necessary at this time to keep the property off the market and to lock in a special rate at the bank. We are under no obligation to purchase.

At the congregational meeting we will discuss the pros and cons of owning the property, what it might mean for the future of Immanuel, and financing ideas and concerns. Please plan to attend to voice your opinion and ask your questions.. We must have a quorum of the membership to conduct a vote, so your attendance is important.

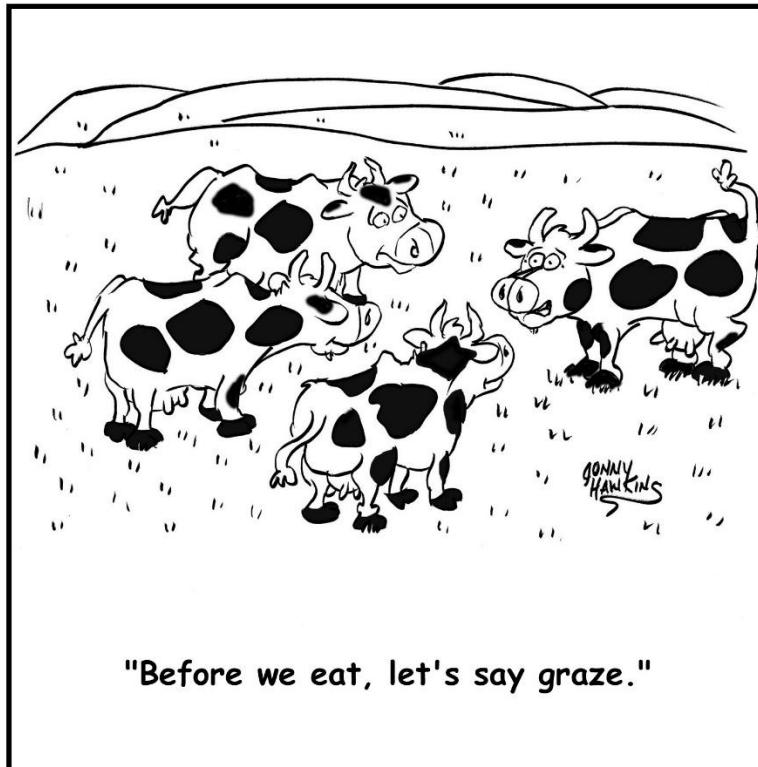

**CALL TO ORDER:** President Char Kinzer called the meeting to order at 5:36 pm.

**Addition(s) to Agenda/Agenda Acceptance:** Mary Ellen Perry moved that we accept the agenda as written. Brian Marquart seconded her motion, and it was approved by voice vote.

**JOYS OF IMMANUEL:** Nancy Heise planted flowers in the garden in the Peace Walk; the Men's Den will be donating \$300 to the Henrickson family at the Meal with a Mission event to be held on July 5 for the fire at their home; and we're having great summer attendance.

### FINANCIAL REPORT:

**Discussion/Acceptance:** Paula Traylor moved that we accept the Financial Report. Debbie Lindahl seconded her motion, and it was approved by voice vote.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS:

**Confirmation:** Nancy Heise prepared a plan of action for the Confirmation program for the coming year to include the current class to use the Luther House of Study lessons on baptism and communion before their confirmation in October. The remaining confirmation students in their second year would be recommended to use the NALC online Zoom program for their study, utilizing volunteers. We will need volunteers/mentors for the remaining classes. Char Kinzer moved that we accept and implement Nancy's plan. Brian Marquart seconded her motion, and it was approved by voice vote.

**Finance:** No report.

**Buildings and Grounds:** The Committee completed the septic line repair at the parsonage. The committee is also looking at what options are available to enhance the security system and make recommendations.

**PASTOR'S REPORT:** Pastor Ian reported that the Men's Den will soon finish their Bible study guide. Attendees at the weekly Adult Sunday School sessions will complete their study soon. Each group will prepare questions based on their study to pass off to the Transition Steering Team to be included in documents for potential minister candidates. Pastor Ian will conduct a New Member class for six families, some with children, in July.

Pastor Ian moved that we close the church on Monday July 6, 2026 to allow the office staff to celebrate the United States of America's 250<sup>th</sup> Fourth of July. George Erickson seconded his motion, and it was approved by voice vote.


